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Card Combination

Awesome 8

Holding the 8 often has a big effect on how you should play tenuous suit combinations. Here's a typically surprising example. Let's say you want to play A5 opposite J10432 for 3 tricks. The right play is to cash the A then duck one all round. If the suit breaks 3-3, a goldfish makes 3 tricks. If it's 4-2, you're looking for someone to hold Kx or Qx so that their honour beats up a couple of low cards. Then we drive out the other honour with the J10.

Now try it with A8 opposite J10432. The right play for 3 tricks is low to the 8! You still make your 3 tricks against all the 3-3 and Hx holdings but now you pick up KQ9x in front of the A8 as well.

And now try it with A4 opposite J10832. The right play for 3 tricks here is to cash the A and then play low to the 8 – picking up the bonus KQ9x on your left instead. If you need 4 tricks, you have a small chance too - lead the J and hope for the squashable 9xx on your left (KQx on your right).

There are far too many combos with an 8 to memorise. Just remember this - if you hold the awesome 8 somewhere in a scrappy suit combination, start thinking about whether you can do something nifty to finesse or squash a higher card.other lines only make 4 or 5 tricks 77% of the time but it's worth the risk at matchpoints to try to get that 5th trick.

Tricky, isn't it?

Board-a-Match Teams Monday August 3rd and 10th

Board-A-Match is the easiest way to score a teams match. If your team scores more than your opponents on a board, even by just 10 points, you win that board. For every board you win, you get 2 Victory Points. For every board you tie, you get 1 Victory Point. No IMPs, no decimal points. Easy!

The fun thing about BAM is that you always feel like you're in the game. Finding the right lead against 2D can win the board for your team just as easily as bidding a tricky 7S. Sometimes at IMPs, your opponents bid a tight slam and make a lucky game and that's pretty much it. At BAM you can get it all back on a couple of partscores!
