After a 2 year break we're putting Donald back on the Bridge map on a permanent basis.

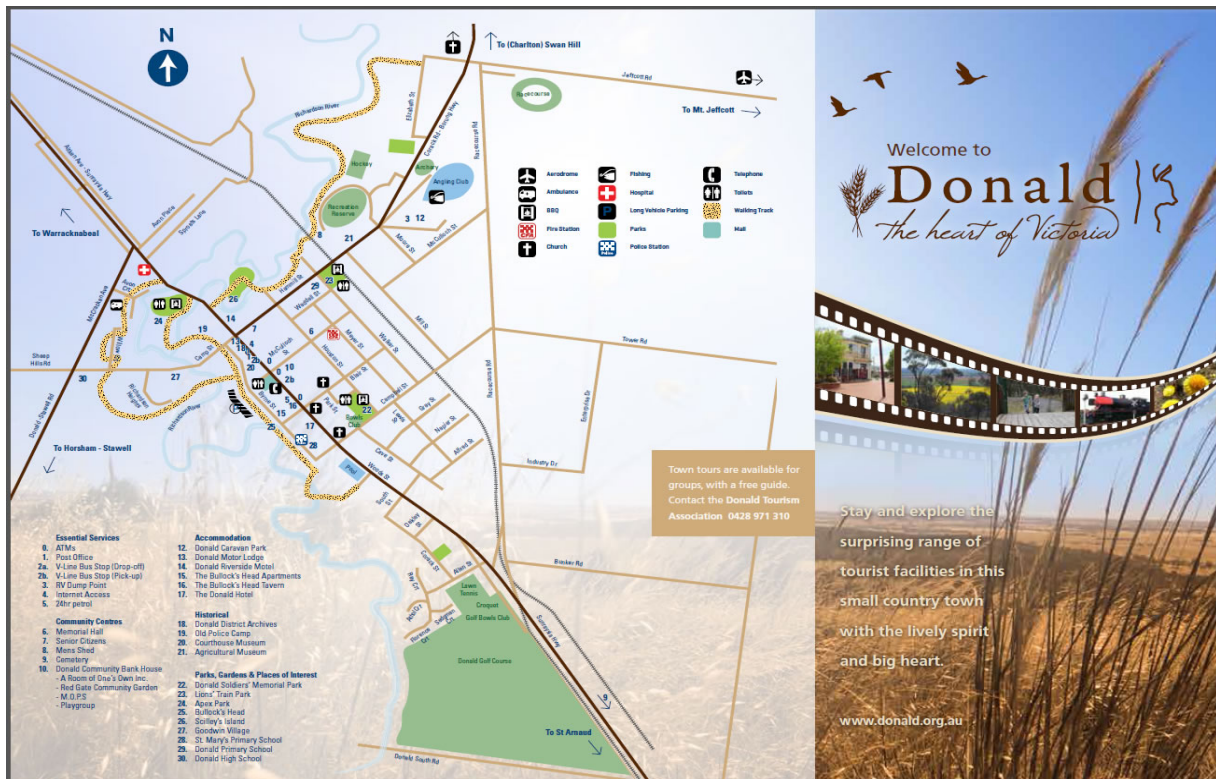

Then head a little further north to Sea Lake to take in the ‘mirror lake’, Lake Tyrrell, which has recently been re-discovered by Chinese and Australian tourists alike for its unique attractions - <http://laketyrrell.com/>

From Sea Lake head west to Patchewollock to enter the acclaimed Silo Art Trail from its northernmost point and continue south to take in all 6 silos – Lascelles, Rosebery, Brim, Sheep Hills and Rupanyup - <http://siloarttrail.com/home/#area-map>

My personal favourite example of silo art is the sepia toned original at Brim. A mini silo tour could be commenced from Donald heading straight to Brim and then on to Sheep Hills and exiting at Rupanyup, the southernmost example.
